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Giunchigliani sees encouraging news in poll

Numbers against multi-term incumbent show weakness, establish strong foundation for Giunchigliani, point to race closing in final months

Chris Giunchigliani sees more than a silver lining in the poll for her race in Clark County Commission, District E, which was released today. “When you start against a multi-term incumbent, you expect to start from behind and work to pull ahead. These results show us closer than I thought I would be this early in the campaign,” Giunchigliani said. “I’m energized by the opportunities and my strong foundation shown in these numbers.”

“When you look at the numbers and put them into perspective, there’s plenty of reason to be optimistic,” Giunchigliani said. “Here are some of the reasons why:

- I start this race with a 32% base in a district where I’ve never run. I will build on that base.
- I only have a 6% negative, compared to my opponent’s 19% which gives me lots of room to move.
- My opponent, with all the advantages of 3-term incumbency and knowing that I was gearing up, can barely crack 50%.
- Despite the power of incumbency, there’s a huge undecided out there which I believe will trend to me because they aren’t already for the incumbent.”

Giunchigliani has not seen the Bolger poll referred to in Jon Ralston’s column, and said she couldn’t comment on specifics or whether the poll was slanted in any way. “It’s been said I will have to outwalk, outwork and out-hustle the incumbent,” Giunchigliani commented. “Those who know me and my energetic campaigns have little doubt that I will.”
